



## The Health FSA Carryover.

The U.S. Treasury Department issued Revenue Procedure 2021-45 for the Health Flexible Spending Account (FSA) Use-or-Lose rule to allow up to a \$570 carryover of Health FSA funds. The carryover is applicable only to Health FSAs (not to Dependent Care FSAs). Any unused amount above the carryover limit is subject to forfeiture and cannot be cashed out or transferred to other taxable or nontaxable benefits (e.g., HSAs).

If your organization offers the carryover option, it's great news for you because:



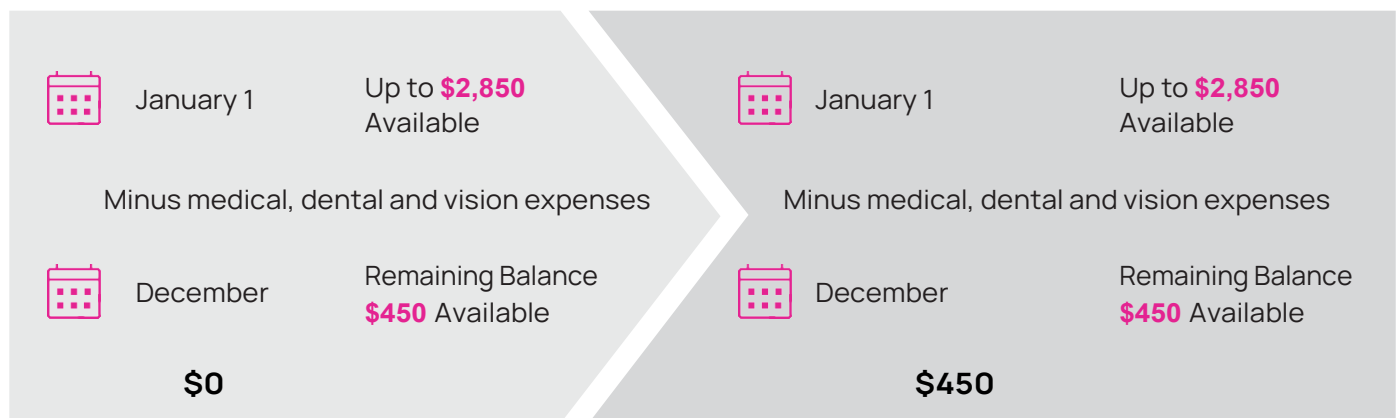
You can now carry over **up to \$570** of your unused Health FSA funds at the end of the plan year.



The money you put in a Health FSA is **not taxed**, so assuming you pay a combined 40 percent state and federal tax rate, you're saving 40 percent on health care expenses funded through the account.
